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2020 influenza vaccine planning.

In order to prevent additional surge on AZ hospitals, flu prevention during covid will be critical. In response many private organizations and local health departments are implementing innovative immunization clinics to increase flu vaccination.

Timeline of Vaccine Delivery:

Influenza vaccine for the 2020/2021 flu season was pre-booked in March, but manufacturers have increased production and expect 190 million private and Federal doses will be available between 08/2020-02/2021.

- **Private Pre-booked Doses:** Shipping started 08/2020 with the majority of orders delivering through September and completing by 12/31/2020.
- **Waitlist doses:** Manufacturers have doses available now and plan to produce more Oct-Jan.

The CDC has contracted for 140,000 additional adult and child flu doses for AZ VFC providers, local health departments (LHD) and Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC)

- **VFC Flu:** Ordering is open now for VFC doses with a limit of 200 doses per order. Typically AZ has 50% of VFC flu allocation at the end of September, and 100% around mid-October. 40,000 additional doses will be available for VFC offices this season. ASIIS inventory order sets reflect available doses.
- **CDC Doses for Local Health Departments (LHD) and Community Health Centers (CHC):** Vaccine can be used for any adult regardless of insurance eligibility. 100,000 doses to be split between LHDs and CHCs.
 - The first doses of FluMist will begin to arrive in Sept. Multi-doses vial/prefilled syringe of quadravalent, and cell based in Oct-Jan.

TIPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL INFLUENZA VACCINATION SEASON

Discuss and outline key strategies to achieve high influenza vaccination coverage rates of your patients and decrease missed opportunities for vaccination.

1. **Recall** any kids you've seen recently for well visits that missed their flu doses
2. **Remind** all patients to come in for their annual influenza vaccination
3. **Expand** hours for influenza vaccination
4. **Allow** influenza vaccine-only visits using [standing orders](#)
5. **Implement** [CDC Guidance](#) for planning vaccination clinics held at satellite, temporary, or off-site locations. ([Portable Cold Storage List](#) Some Counties use [Cool Cube](#))
6. **Track** kids that will be due to return to the practice for a second dose
7. **It's not too late!** Flu cases are reported year round in AZ, so continue vaccinating for flu through the spring.

VFC/VFA Influenza Distribution

- Updated ADHS VFC flu swapping and borrowing policy [Link](#)
- Partial shipments will arrive to the warehouse throughout the season at regular intervals.
- Not all presentations arrive at the same time. You might have to substitute your 1st preference for presentations that AIPO has received. Current limit is 200 doses until AZ reaches full supply.
- If you receive smaller more frequent orders, you must reorder the remaining doses needed. Each reorder will require inventory reconciliation and current temp logs.
Note: Orders cannot be approved without temp logs. Be sure to check the ASIIS inventory comment box to make sure there isn't a hold up on your order.

Influenza Guidance with ASIIS

- Flu doses must be received in ASIIS before they are administered to patients.
- Flu doses received should be administered and recorded in ASIIS as soon as possible.
- Orders for additional vaccine may be put on hold or denied if it appears that orders are not received in ASIIS.
- Orders for additional vaccine may be reduced or denied if it appears that previously delivered doses have yet to be administered. (For example: if you received 100 doses and are placing a new order for 75 additional doses and ASIIS shows that you have not administered more than half of the originally delivered doses, your order may be reduced/ denied). Use the comment box if you have a large clinic planned.
- ASIIS information is the only information that the Arizona Immunization Program Office has available to make this determination. Check ASIIS frequently for regular updates and specific notices to providers.

WHEN ORDERING MORE VFC/VFA FLU DOSES CONSIDER:

The number of flu doses you'll need during the ordering period, consider any planned reminder/recall influenza vaccination outreach efforts, and the age of scheduled patients— Check how many doses you have on hand, and order more for upcoming clinics. Consider smaller more frequent orders.

You'll need to report vaccine doses administered to date as part of ordering and make sure the temperature data logger reports are current.

Orders ship in full once the State receives its full allocation, make sure you can store all the doses you requested. Orders cannot be canceled once sent for fulfillment.

Link to Updated [Borrowing Policy](#) Note: While you are able to return VFC doses it is not always the case with private. If you borrow your private stock for VFC patients and then get VFC replacement late in the season you'll want make sure you've only borrowed an amount that you are sure you'll be able to administer later.

COVID-19 Vaccination Program Provider Profile Information

What to prepare for Each Vaccinating Location

All initial doses of covid 19 vaccine will be Federally supplied. To order covid-19 vaccine all locations must sign up with ADHS including existing VFC/VFA providers. [Enrollment link](#)

Please have the following information ready:

- Location name
- Contact information for primary & backup COVID19 vaccine coordinators
- Address for receiving and vaccination sites (if different)
- Days & times vaccine coordinators available to receive vaccine shipments
- Vaccination provider types (e.g., tribal health, IHS, hospital, FQHC, etc.)
- Vaccination setting (e.g., workplace, community center, mobile clinic, etc.)
- Approximate number of patients/clients routinely served
- Identify groups for early phase vaccination. Identify and estimate the number of the following patients/employees:
 - Health care personnel likely to be exposed to or care for people with COVID-19.
 - Patients at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19, including those with underlying medical conditions and people aged 65 and older.
 - Health care personnel at risk of getting or transmitting COVID-19 to patients in their care who are at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19.
- Influenza vaccination capacity in 2019/2020 influenza season
- Populations served by this location (e.g., pregnant women, pediatric, persons over 65)
- Use of immunization information system (IIS)
- Storage capacity based on number of 10-dose multidose vials, at these temperature ranges:
 - Refrigerated, 2°C to 8°C
 - Frozen, -15°C to -25°C
 - Ultra-frozen, -60°C to -80°C
- List of brands/models/types of storage units to be used for storing COVID-19 vaccine
- List of providers practicing at facility who have prescribing authority & licensure number
- Signatures of Chief Executive Officer and Chief Medical Officer on Provider Agreement Conditions

Providers are also encouraged to partner with county health departments.

Covid-19 Vaccine Provider Agreement Conditions

1. Administer COVID-19 vaccine in accordance with all requirements and recommendations of CDC and CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices.
2. With 24 hours, submit vaccine administration data through either:
 - a. Immunization information system (IIS) of the state or
 - b. Another system designated by CDC according to CDC documentation and data requirements
3. Must not sell or seek reimbursement for COVID-19 vaccine and any adjuvant, syringes, needles, or other constituent products and ancillary supplies that the federal government provides without cost to organization.
4. Administer COVID-19 vaccine regardless of the vaccine recipient's ability to pay COVID-19 vaccine administration fees. AZ Admin Fee \$21.33
5. Before administering COVID-19 vaccine, provide an approved Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) fact sheet or vaccine information statement (VIS), as required, to each vaccine recipient, the adult caregiver accompanying the recipient, or other legal representative
6. COVID-19 vaccination services must be conducted in compliance with CDC's Guidance for Immunization Services During the COVID-19 Pandemic for safe delivery of vaccines.
7. Comply with CDC requirements for COVID-19 vaccine management:
 - a. Store and handle vaccine under proper conditions, including maintaining cold chain conditions and chain of custody at all times in accordance with the manufacturer's package insert and CDC guidance in CDC's Vaccine Storage and Handling Toolkit, which will be updated to include specific information related to COVID-19 vaccine.
 - b. Monitor vaccine storage unit temperatures at all times using equipment and practices that comply with guidance in CDC's Vaccine Storage and Handling Toolkit.
 - c. Comply with state immunization program guidance for dealing with temperature excursions.
 - d. Monitor and comply with COVID-19 vaccine expiration dates.
 - e. Keep records for minimum of 3 years or longer if required by state.
8. Report the number of doses of COVID-19 vaccine and adjuvants that were unused, spoiled, expired, or wasted as required by the relevant jurisdiction.
9. Comply with all federal instructions and timelines for disposing of COVID-19 vaccine and adjuvant, including unused doses.
10. Report moderate and severe adverse events following vaccination to the Vaccine Adverse Event Reporting System (VAERS).
11. Provide a completed COVID-19 vaccination record card to every COVID-19 vaccine recipient, the adult caregiver accompanying the recipient, or other legal representative (cards will be available in ancillary kits).
12. A: Organization must comply with all applicable requirements as set forth by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, including but not limited to requirements in any EUA that covers COVID-19 vaccine.
B: Administer COVID-19 vaccine in compliance with all applicable state and territorial vaccination laws.
